- The Amnesty Programme for Late Registration of Births (ALRB 2019) was initiated by the Ministry and funded by UNICEF under its Child Protection Program, took place Monday 15th April to Friday 31st May, 2019. The objective was to register all births that have occurred in Tonga of living non-registered individuals and those late registrations were free of charge. At present the following results were obtained from the said project:

CEO Appointment


Mrs Temaleti Manakovi Aleamotu'a Pahulu of Kolomotu'a was appointed as the Chief Executive Officer for the Ministry of Justice for a four year term.
She has been the Acting CEO since the said position became vacant in 2018.

Mrs Pahulu holds a Bachelor of Laws (1992) from the University of East London, United Kingdom, and a Bachelor of Arts in History and Anthropology (1985) from the University of Auckland, New Zealand. She first entered into the civil service in 1986 as a Senior Executive Officer at the Supreme Court, and in between her studies served in the Crown Law Department, the Supreme Court Registry, and the Ministry of Justice. She was appointed Chief Registrar of the Supreme Court in 2007, and in 2009 was a Relieving Magistrate in the Magistrates Court. Mrs Pahulu became the Deputy Secretary in the Registrar General's Office from 2012 until her recent appointment to CEO of Justice. We wish her well and congratulate her as she embarks on her new responsibilities in the Ministry of Justice.
